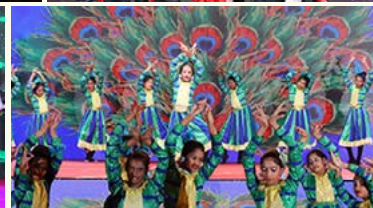
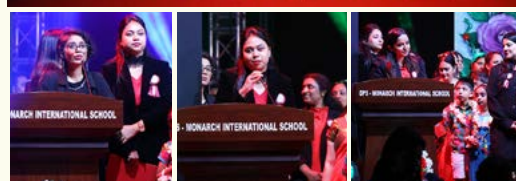


DPS-Monarch Annual Day PRIMARY SCHOOL PRODUCTION

International Mathematics and Science Study (TIMSS)

The International Association for the Evaluation of Educational Achievement (IEA) is an independent international cooperative of national research institutions and government agencies that has been conducting studies of cross-national achievement since 1959. Internationally recognized as a valid and reliable measure of student achievement in Mathematics and Science at the Fourth and Eighth grades, IEA's TIMSS has reported on international achievement trends every four years since 1995.

TIMSS 2023 is the eighth assessment, enabling participating countries to chart the progress of their education systems over a 28-year period. TIMSS is designed to measure and interpret differences in national educational systems in order to help improve the teaching and learning of Mathematics and Science worldwide. Since the 2019 cycle, TIMSS has transitioned from paper-pencil to computer-based administration.

More than 60 countries participated in TIMSS 2023. Qatar is one of the countries that participated in this important project. In Qatar, a sample of schools had been selected. **DPS Monarch International School** is one of them. Around fifty four students from **Grade IV B and VIII D** took the TIMSS Achievement Test and completed Student Questionnaire as well. The test was timed and was taken up by the students on the TIMSS Player software. TIMSS Test In charges were **Mr. Aban Samuel and Ms. Nausheen Ali**.



Scholastic Aptitude Test

DPS Monarch International School is a centre for **SAT (Scholastic Aptitude Test)** which is a standardized test administered by the College Board. SAT is the exam given by students who wish to seek admission in undergraduates' program from many prestigious universities in India and abroad.

A Digital SAT was conducted on **11th March, 2023** which was of three hours and consisted of three tests: **1. Reading Test, 2. Writing and Language Tests and 3. Math Test**. A hundred and ten students from different schools around Qatar came up to take up the test. The test was conducted smoothly with proper guidance rendered to the students and quadrant planning.

With only a few schools being recognized as a center, DPS Monarch International School as one of the centers for SAT is one of the greatest achievements and instant pride as not only the students from our school but all the students in our community will be benefited due to familiar surroundings and easy access.

Qatar National Schools Accreditation (QNSA)

The State of Qatar launched the Qatar National Schools Accreditation (QNSA) for private schools in 2011 which provides quality assessments on schools based on their academic, educational and administrative performances.

For a school to start the **Qatar National Accreditation** process, it must pass the mandatory Evaluation, which ensures that a school has achieved the basic requirements needed to move on to the accreditation process to ensure the quality of education and its development.

In order to highlight areas of strength and at the same time to obtain recommendation to resolve some areas that will result in improvement, the framework of School Evaluation Administration works together on four major categories including a set of important aspects such as Educational Leadership, Educational Performance, Development and Welfare of Learners and Resource Management.

For each category, Teachers In-charges are working in co-ordination and monitoring the working of school to maintain it up to international standards in terms of quality and performance. The inspection by QNSA Team will be done from 10th to 12th April, 2023.

Principal, Ms. Meenal Bakshi under her guidance and mentorship carried out a detailed workshop to explain the working of QNSA and the procedures to be followed for the same.

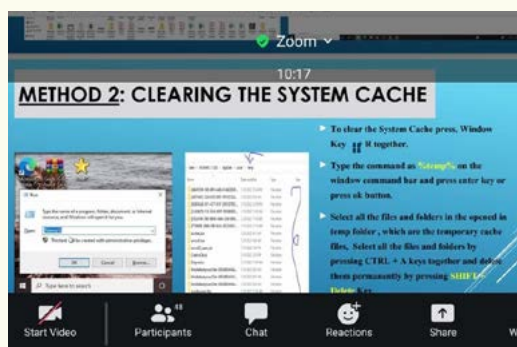
The participants actively participated in the discussion and overall the workshop was informative and enlightening.

- ▶ Saving passwords in the browser for your different user login accounts is not recommended. Chrome allows you to see those passwords, if you know the system's password which can lead to a security breach.
- ▶ Depending on the browser, if hackers gained access to your computer, they could extract the contents of the database – and get access to ALL your private logins.
- ▶ Avoid Browsing the Un Secured Websites, Which does not Certified with HTTP'S. Hackers have a chance to take your details saved in your browsers.

He added that several sites are accessible from the school network, and few sites are not accessible and are blocked in school network due to security issues. 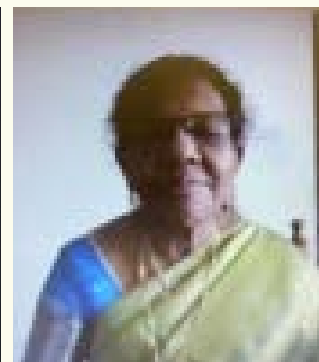
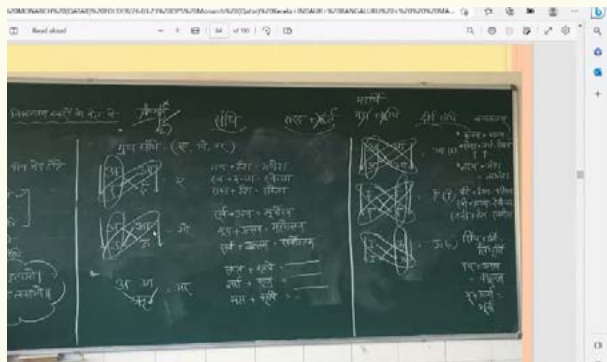

To accomplish, our goal as an educator is to impart a passion for education within the classroom. The session was very informative and enriching.



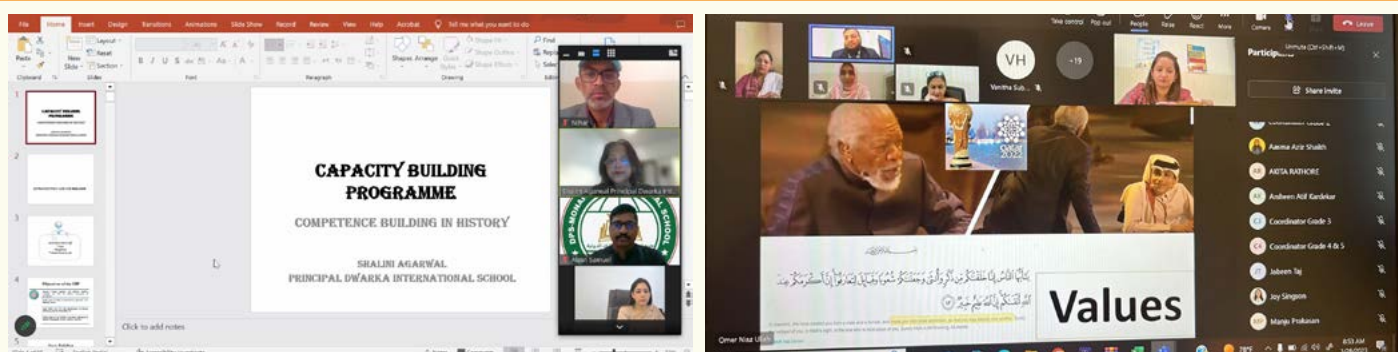

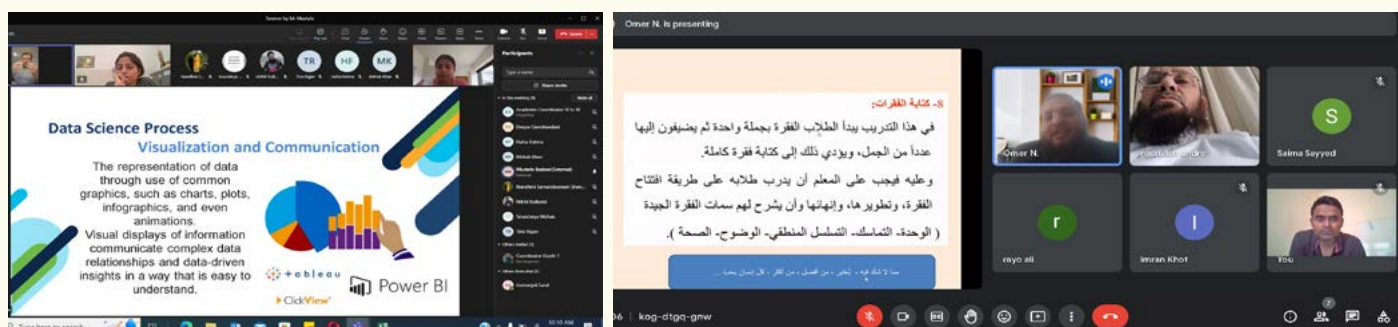

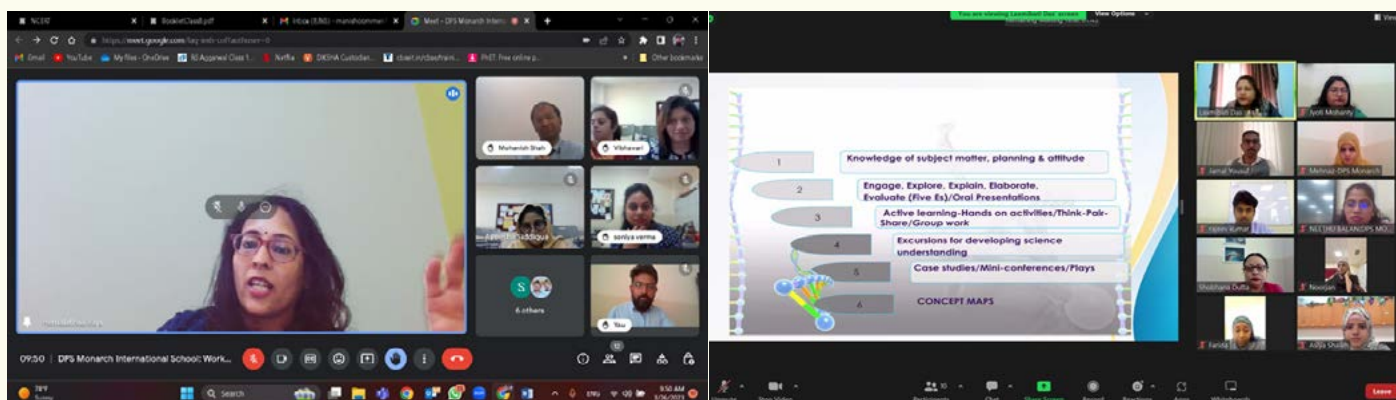

"Parents are the ultimate role models for children."

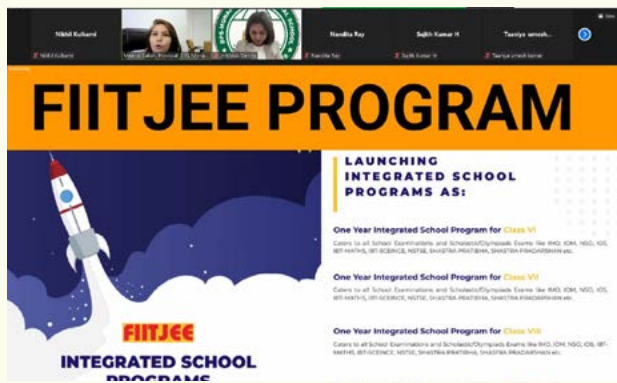

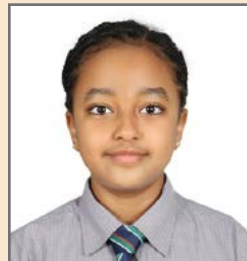

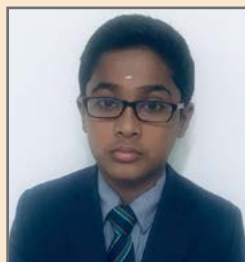
